

# MacBride Museum of Yukon History

## Kids Camps

### 1. MacBride P.I. (Private Investigator) Camp

Campers learn about Yukon's Mountie history through activities, games and a visit from former Yukon Superintendent Hank Moorlag. Campers will get a chance to hone their detective skills and solve a mystery at the end of the week.

### 2. Yukon Mad Scientist Camp

Campers conduct whacky experiments and learn cool science tricks like building an erupting volcano, making paper rockets and more.

### 3. Dig it Yukon Camp

Campers will act as archaeologists to uncover real bones and artifacts in our dig box. This also explores real archaeological discoveries and how we learn about the past by examining the things people leave behind.

### 4. Wild World of Yukon Animals Camp

Bald eagles, beavers and bears...oh my! Campers will learn about Yukon's wildlife and how it has changed from prehistory to today. This camp also includes a morning tour at the Yukon Wildlife Preserve.

### 5. Yukon Gold Fever Camp

Campers create a play based on the shootout between Soapy Smith and Frank Reid while learning about Klondike Gold Rush history. Activities in this camp are based on *Aurore of the Yukon*, a novel for young readers about a girl's adventures during the Klondike Gold Rush.

### 6. Yukon Secret Agents Camp

Campers crack codes and create ciphers while solving a mystery set around the Alaska-Canada boundary dispute of 1903. Activities in this camp are based on *Yukon Secret Agents*, a novel for young readers about the adventures of a group of young sleuths during the Alaska-Canada boundary dispute.

### 7. Yukon Ghost Hunters Camp

Campers learn about the important people from Whitehorse's past who are remembered in the museum, the Pioneer Cemetery and all around town. They also take a day trip to Canyon City to explore the abandoned townsite. Activities in this camp are based on *Yukon River Ghost*, a novel for young readers.

### 8. Game On Yukon Camp

By following the Dawson City Nuggets 1905 challenge for the Stanley Cup, campers learn about geography and what life was like at the turn of the century. Activities in this camp are based on *Game On Yukon*, a novel for young readers.
